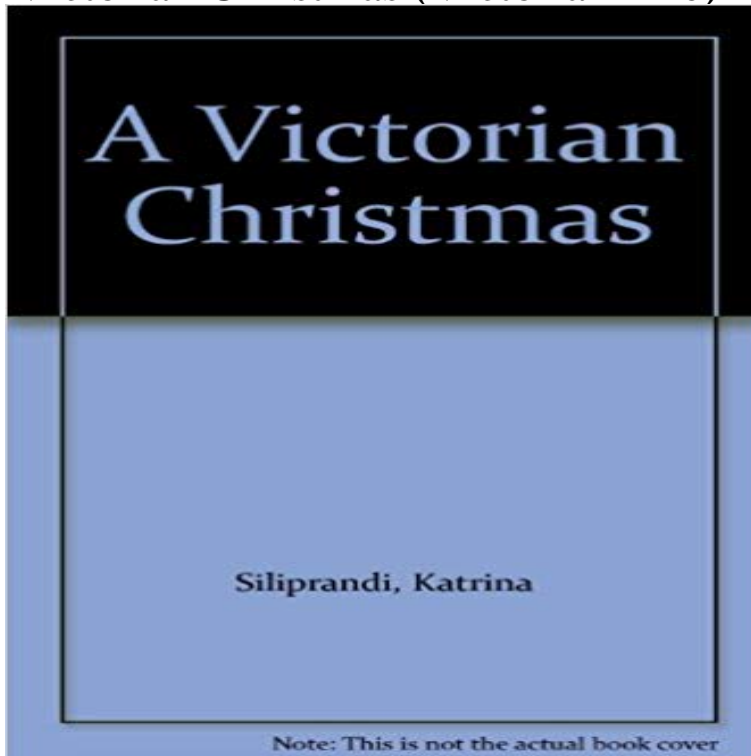


Victorian Christmas (Victorian Life)
