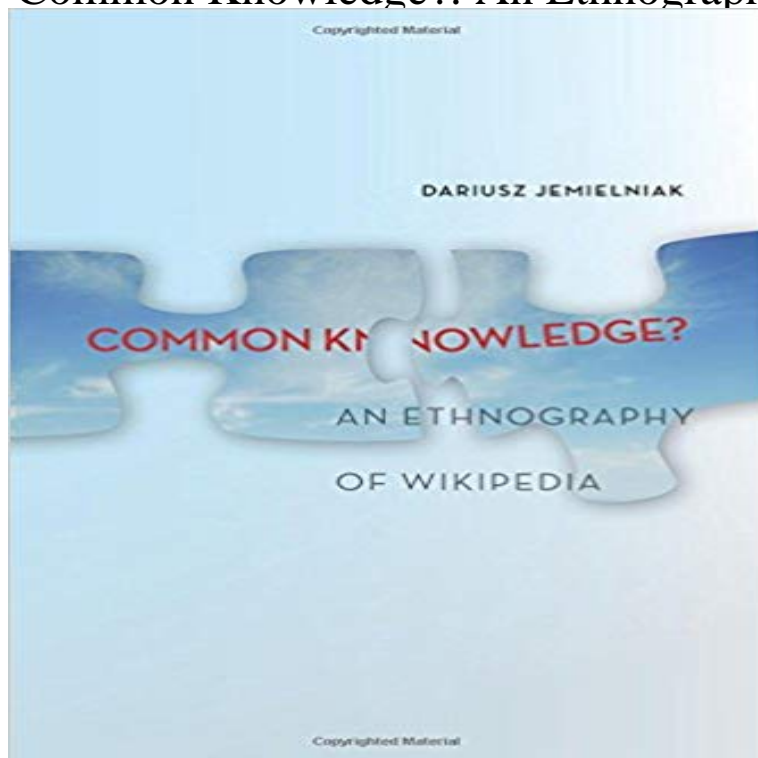


Common Knowledge?: An Ethnography of Wikipedia
