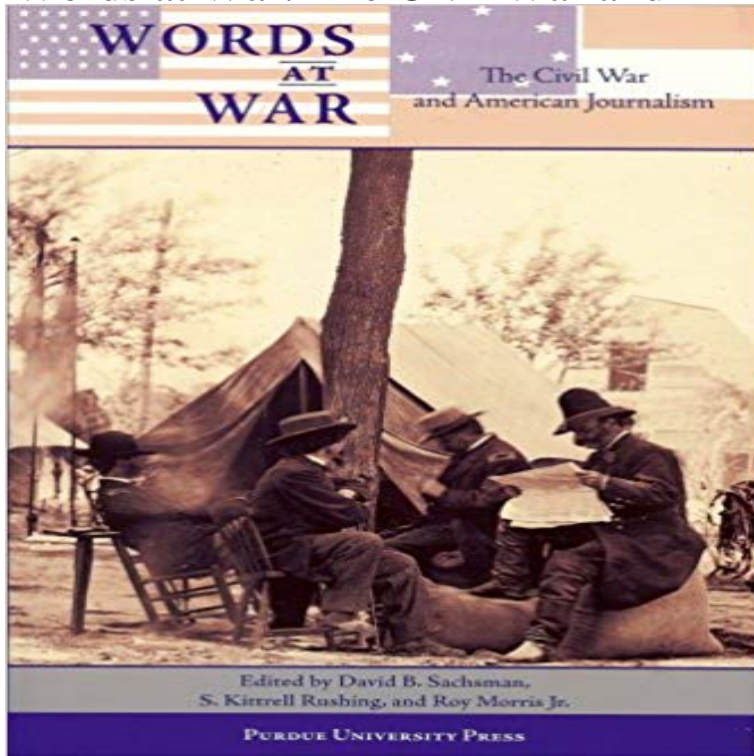


Words at War: The Civil War and American Journalism
