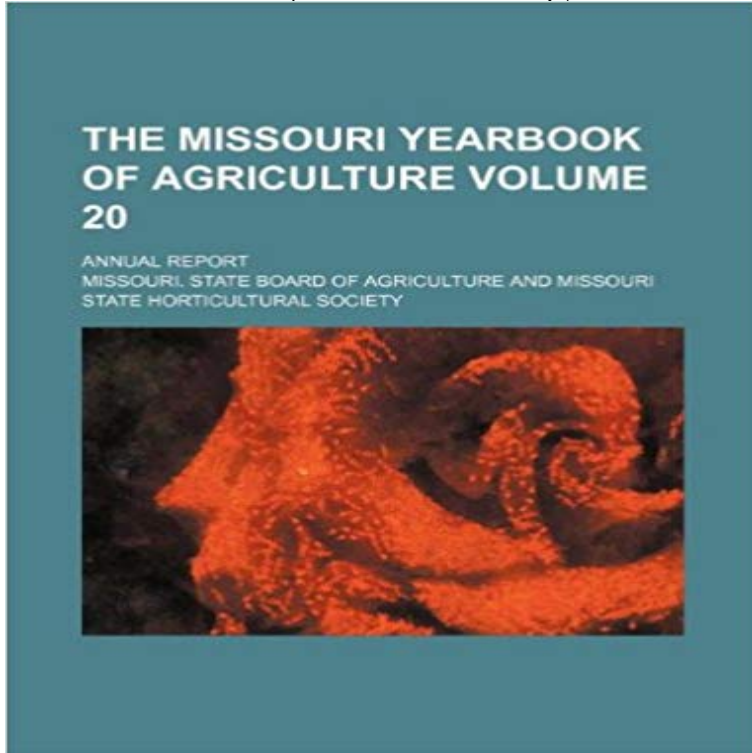

Not illustrated. 1888 Excerpt: ...eyes are made up of from a few hundred to several thousand small eyes, each perfect in itself. Their sense of touch is most developed on their antennae or feelers and legs, which are covered with fine hairs. In most insects the seat of touch is in the organs surrounding the mouth, although in the cockroach and in a kind of fly, the nose is in the tail. Some grasshoppers have their ears on their abdomen just behind their wings, and in others they are on the legs. The noises produced by insects are generally produced by rubbing together different parts of the body. Insects seem to show great foresight in depositing their eggs, as they always place them upon or in close proximity to the substances which they feed on as larvae. Many insects pass the winter in the egg form, and as they are so sealed up that they are impervious to moisture? they are uninjured by the severest winters. At the proper time the egg hatches and the young insect appears. In most cases it has a worm-like form and is called a larva. In this stage they are sometimes as in the bee, without legs, but generally they have three pairs of true legs, from five to eight pairs of pro or false legs, except the measuring worm, which has but two pairs. While most insects pass but a few days or perhaps weeks in this form, one, the so-called seventeen year locust, lives for nearly seventeen years as a larva. During this period the insects are very voracious and spend most of their time eating. As they increase rapidly in size, they soon outgrow their clothes; the old suit splits along the back and the insect steps out in a new suit which it wore under the old one. This at first is soft and allows the larva to increase in size, but it soon is too small for them

and it is shed a second time. Many insects
